2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion by Kemble, second by Northrop to approve minutes of June 15, 2018 meeting. Motion approved on a voice vote.

3. PUBLIC COMMENT

5. DISCUSSION OF STRATEGIES TO ENGAGE COMMUNITY IN DISCUSSION OF TFOGS DRAFT RECOMMENDATIONS

The Subcommittee discussed strategies to engage residents regarding the Task Force's proposed recommendations to the Common Council. The Subcommittee noted that the Task Force had not yet formed its recommendations but that this Subcommittee should begin identifying strategies for engaging the public. To do this, the Subcommittee should decide what message it wants to send and identified individuals and organizations who can help get the word out. Maggie Northrop volunteered to draft a message for consideration at the next Subcommittee meeting. The Subcommittee instructed staff to check with David Trowbridge in City Planning to determine how they engage with people on the Bus Rapid Transit Survey. Additionally, the Subcommittee noted the success of the Oscar Meyer reception and asked staff to gather information pertaining to how that engagement happened.

6. DISCUSSION OF WHETHER TO HIRE AN OUTSIDE CONSULTANT TO CONDUCT PUBLIC OUTREACH

The Subcommittee discussed whether to hire a consultant while discussing Item 5 and, in particular, whether doing so would be helpful.
