Call to Order/Roll Call

The meeting was called to order at 4:32pm. Alder Govindarajan joined after roll call.

Public Comment

1. 89652 PUBLIC COMMENT

There was written comment on agenda items #2 and #8. There were 2 registrants. 1 registrant wishing to speak on item #2, and 1 registrant available to answer questions on item #5.

Disclosures and Recusals

Alder Verveer noted a disclosure on agenda item 8, file 89347, as a non-voting ex officio member of the Downtown Madison Incorporated Board of Directors.

Consent Agenda

A motion was made by Vidaver, seconded by Madison, to Adopt the Consent Agenda. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

Agenda items 2-3, and 6-14 were adopted as part of the consent agenda.

Items to be Considered

2. 89254 Amending Sections 4.095, 10.05, 10.055, 10.08, 10.101, 23.24 and 1.08(3)(a) and Creating Section 10.105 of the Madison General Ordinances to enhance the City's street tree protection provisions and to establish a Street Tree Replacement Fund.

A motion was made by Vidaver, seconded by Govindarajan, to Return to Lead with the Recommendation for Approval to the BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS. The motion passed by voice vote/other. Alder Figueroa Cole voted "no" on the item.

3. Authorizing the settlement and payment of a tax refund for tax year 2023 for 1255 Fourier LLC v. City of Madison, Dane County Circuit Court Case

number 2024CV001488. Authorizing entry into settlement agreement and approving payment of approximately \$76,036.22 from City resources to effectuate the settlement, \$30,360.03 represents the City's approximate portion of the settlement. (District 9)

A motion was made by Vidaver, seconded by Evers, to RECOMMEND TO COUNCIL TO ADOPT - REPORT OF OFFICER. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

4. 89270 Approving Plans and Specifications for the Site Restoration of 114 E Wilson St (Former Government East Ramp). (District 4)

A motion was made by Vidaver, seconded by Evers, to Return to Lead with the Recommendation for Common Council to Adopt to the BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

5. 89324 Authorizing the Mayor and the City Clerk to execute an amendment to the Breese Stevens Stadium Use and Operating Agreement with Big Top Events LLC to update the limitations on alcohol sales at Stadium Events. (District 6)

- 7. 89338 Approving the fabrication, installation, and locations of a visual land acknowledgement by James Terry and two murals by Rodrigo Carapia and Issis Macias, at the Madison Public Market and authorizing the Planning Division Director to sign any necessary contracts, agreements, and other documents to implement the project (District 12).

8. 89347 Authorizing execution of a sole source \$150,000 contract with Downtown Madison Inc. for the preparation of a Downtown Economic Investment Strategy (District 2, District 4, District 6, District 8, and District 13).

A motion was made by Vidaver, seconded by Evers, to RECOMMEND TO COUNCIL TO ADOPT - REPORT OF OFFICER. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

Accepting the Economic Development Division's "2025 Small Business
Assistance Policy Paper" as the basis for structuring and conducting a
Request for Proposals (RFP) process and authorizing the Community and
Economic Development Divisions to undertake this process and recommend,
for approval by the Common Council, a funding allocation plan regarding
awards and contracts that will take effect on or after January 1, 2026
(Citywide).

Amending the capital improvement projects identified in the Hawthorne-Truax Neighborhood Plan, previously approved by Common Council via RES-24-00690 (Legistar #85812), to redirect Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds from lighting improvements to the creation of an art mural at Hawthorne Elementary School (District 12).

A motion was made by Vidaver, seconded by Evers, to RECOMMEND TO COUNCIL TO ADOPT - REPORT OF OFFICER. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

11. 89356

Authorizing a loan of up to \$43,000 to Solace Friends, Inc. from the Community Facilities Loan Program to help finance exterior improvements to its facility located at 4142 Monona Drive, Madison WI, and authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to sign an agreement for that purpose (District 15).

A motion was made by Vidaver, seconded by Evers, to RECOMMEND TO COUNCIL TO ADOPT - REPORT OF OFFICER. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

12. 89378

Authorizing the allocation of up to \$2,000,000 of City Affordable Housing Funds to help the Madison Revitalization and Community Development Corporation (MRCDC) finance the rehabilitation and preservation of seven (7) units of rental housing and common area improvements at separate scattered site properties, and the Community Development Authority (CDA) finance the rehabilitation and preservation of eleven (11) units of rental housing at Monona Shores Apartments, and authorizing the Mayor and the City Clerk to enter into Loan Agreements. (District 5, District 10, District 11, District 14, District 16)

A motion was made by Vidaver, seconded by Evers, to RECOMMEND TO COUNCIL TO ADOPT - REPORT OF OFFICER. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

13. <u>89266</u>

Amending the 2025 Adopted Engineering-Bicycle & Pedestrian Capital Budget and awarding Public Works Contract 8739, Tancho Dr Bike Path & Northeast Pond Repair. (District 17)

A motion was made by Vidaver, seconded by Evers, to RECOMMEND TO COUNCIL TO ADOPT (15 VOTES REQUIRED) - REPORT OF OFFICER. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

Amending the Parks Divisions 2025 Adopted Capital Budget using Golf Revenue Reserves for the purchase of specialized turf management equipment for the City of Madison Golf Courses. (District 11, District 13, District 15, and District 16)

A motion was made by Vidaver, seconded by Evers, to RECOMMEND TO COUNCIL TO ADOPT (15 VOTES REQUIRED) - REPORT OF OFFICER. The motion passed by voice vote/other.
