Thanks for letting me know! It looks like the 411 Gilman project is not on the agenda for Nov 19th, but it's fine to include my comments below whenever that proposal is discussed.

By the way, I see that the other 425 Frances / 450 Gilman proposal is on the agenda for the next meeting. I really don't want to be annoying or excessive in providing my comments, but I have concerns with this Frances / Gilman proposal as well -- particularly the odd and extraneous pool area roof overhang (just keep within vertical column), and the lower street level sections of the building are too light colored and plain (especially the side walls on Gilman facing the book bindery building) with a sort of cheap "cinder block" look with simple edges - maybe more features or windows on plain sidewalls and a darker brick color on lower sections offsetting the light wood colored accents would be better in my opinion. Also, could parking entrance be moved to the other side to hide mid block? However, I do like the middle tower portion of the building and think it is improved from the earlier design.

Sorry I could not resist providing further comments on this other project :). Thanks again for your consideration.

Dear Ms. Vaughn,

I recently saw the updated renderings for the 411 W Gilman St proposal (see link below) and would like to comment on the updated design of the building. First, on the positive side, I like the overall structure, setbacks and angles of the building with the incorporation of glass and balconies, and I think there are improvements in the brick colors chosen for the three street-level sections relative to the previous design, which is also differentiated from the restored historical facade. However, I think the color change for the paneling on the upper portion of the building to white is a terrible choice — it should be a darker color, such as grey/slate. Even the prior terracotta color would be better. Although I also do not like the orange colored accents and awnings on the front of the building, I can tolerate it as a bold artistic element. Anyway, I really would prefer to sit back and just admire all of the developments in the city, but when I saw these updated plans for the building, I felt the need to comment on the updated design.

If only the color of the upper paneling could be changed to a darker color, such as a darker grey, it would be a great design for the building, but the white paneling on the upper portion of the building would be a regrettable mistake.
