


- Hint at the historic Mendota canoe discoveries

#### Madison Arts Commission Recommendation of May 13, 2025

Approve the design with the following changes:

- 1. Use the inverted lower quadrants but switch the location of the cattails to the left, and deer to the right to help the design feel more balanced.
- 2. Combine the color and grey scale designs, keeping the grey scale in the quadrants but pulling in the colored center and green border, as pictured.
- 3. Approved to use portions of the design such as the cattails on the glass of the entryway doors.
