SUBJECT: 2220 and 2221 Daniels Street

Dear Mr. Ring:

The Plan Commission, at its November 7, 2005, meeting, determined that the ordinance standards could be met subject to the conditions below for a conditional use for an accessory parking lot located at 2220 Daniels Street.

In order to receive final approval of your proposal, the following conditions must be met:

Please contact John Leach, City Traffic Engineering, at 266-4761 if you have questions regarding the following five items:

- 1. When the applicant submits final plans for approval, the applicant shall show the following: items in the terrace as existing (e.g., signs and street light poles), type of surfaces, existing property lines, addresses, one contiguous plan (showing all easements, all pavement markings, building placement and stalls), signage, percent of slope, vehicle routes, dimensions of radii, aisles, driveways, stalls including the two (2) feet overhang, and a scaled drawing at 1 inch = 20 feet.
- 2. The applicant shall modify the driveway approach according to the design criteria for a "Class III" driveway in accordance to Madison General Ordinance Section 10.08(4). The applicant shall modify the Class 3 approach with sidewalk across the top and concrete apron, noted on site plan.
- 3. The developer shall post a deposit or reimburse the City for all costs associated with any modifications to Traffic Signals, Street Lighting, Signing and Pavement Marking, and conduit and handholes, including labor, engineering, and materials for both temporary and permanent installations.
- 4. The developer shall post a deposit or reimburse the City for all costs associated with any modifications to Street Lighting, Signing and Pavement Marking including labor and materials for both temporary and permanent installations.
- 5. Public signing and marking related to the development may be required by the City Traffic Engineer for which the developer shall be financially responsible.

- 6. The comments of the City Engineer only pertain to the proposed parking lot at 2220 Daniels Street. The plan routed included construction on 2221 Daniels Street as well as 2220 Daniels Street. Per direction of the Planning staff, only 2220 is to be considered (as auxiliary parking for 2221).
- 7. Current improvements do not require a stormwater management or erosion control plan but future improvements are additive when total "new" impervious area exceeds 20,000 SF. All stormwater requirements shall be retroactively applied. The applicant can meet requirements at this time if desired.
- 8. The applicant is advised to plan utility services to the future building on 2220 Daniels Street, to avoid the possibility of excavating the parking lot presently proposed.
- 9. All work in the public right-of-way shall be performed by a City licensed contractor.
- 10. The plan set shall be revised to show a proposed private internal drainage system on the site. This information shall include the depths and locations of structures and the type of pipe to be used.
- 11. The applicant shall demonstrate compliance with Section 37.07 and 37.08 of the Madison General Ordinances regarding permissible soil loss rates. The erosion control plan shall include Universal Soil Loss Equation (USLE) computations for the construction period. Measures shall be implemented in order to maintain a soil loss rate below 7.5-tons per acre per year.
- 12. Prior to approval, this project shall comply with Chapter 37 of the Madison General Ordinances regarding stormwater management. Please contact Greg Fries at 267-1199 to discuss this requirement.
- 13. The Applicant shall submit, prior to plan sign-off, digital CAD files to the Engineering Program Specialist in the Engineering Division (Lori Zenchenko). The digital copies shall be to scale and represent final construction.

CAD submittals can be either AutoCAD (dwg), MicroStation (dgn) or Universal (dxf) formats and contain the following data, each on a separate layer name/level number:

- a) Building Footprints
- b) Internal Walkway Areas
- c) Internal Site Parking Areas
- d) Other Miscellaneous Impervious Areas (i.e. gravel, crushed stone, bituminous/asphalt, concrete, etc.)

14. NR-151 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code will be effective on October 1, 2004. Future phases of this project shall comply with NR 151 in effect when work commences. Specifically, any phases not covered by a Notice of Intent (NOI) received from the WDNR under NR-216 prior to October 1, 2004 shall be responsible for compliance with all requirements of NR-151 Subchapter III. As most of the requirements of NR-151 are currently implemented in Chapter 37 of the Madison General Ordinances, the most significant additional requirement shall be that of infiltration.

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NR-151 requires infiltration in accord with the following criteria. For the type of development, the site shall comply with one of the three (3) options provided below:

Residential developments shall infiltrate 90% of the predevelopment infiltration amount, 25% of the runoff from the 2-year post development storm or dedicated a maximum of 1% of the site area to active infiltration practices.

Commercial development shall infiltrate 60% of the predevelopment infiltration amount, 10% of the runoff from the 2-year post development storm or dedicate a maximum of 2% of the site area to active infiltration practices.

- 15. The Applicant shall obtain a Street Excavation permit for the installation of utilities required to serve this project. The Applicant shall pay the permit fee, inspection fee and street degradation fee as applicable and shall comply with all the conditions of the permit.
- 16. The applicant shall obtain all necessary sewer connection permits and sewer plugging permits prior to any utility work.
- 17. All outstanding Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) and City of Madison sanitary sewer connection charges are due and payable prior to connection to the public sewerage system.
- 18. The site plan shall be revised to show all existing public sanitary sewer facilities in the project area as well as the size and alignment of the proposed service.

Please contact Kathy Voeck, the Assistant Zoning Administrator, at 266-4551 if you have questions regarding the following five items:

- 19. On the 2221 Daniels Street property, meet all applicable State accessible requirements, including but not limited to:
 - a) Provide a minimum of two accessible stalls striped per State requirements. A minimum of one of the stalls shall be a van accessible stall 8 foot wide with an 8 foot striped out area adjacent.
 - b) Show signage at the head of the stalls.
 - c) Show the accessible path from the stalls to the building.
- 20. On the 2221 Daniels Street property, provide a minimum of **three** bike parking stalls in a safe and convenient location on an impervious surface to be shown on the final plan. The lockable enclosed lockers or racks or equivalent structures in or upon which the bicycle may be locked by the user shall be securely anchored to the ground or building to prevent the lockers or racks from being removed from the location. NOTE: A bike parking stall is two feet by six feet with a five-foot access area. Structures that require a user-supplied locking device shall be designed to accommodate U-shaped locking devices.
- 21. Provide a detailed landscape plan. Show species and sizes of landscape elements. Provide a landscape worksheet with the final plans that shows that the landscaping provided meets the point and required tree ordinances. In order to count toward required points, the landscaping shall be within 15 feet and 20 feet of the parking lot depending on the type of landscape element. (NOTE: The required trees do not count toward the landscape point total.)

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- 22. Lighting is not required. However, if it is provided, it must comply with the City of Madison outdoor lighting standards. (See parking lot packet.) Lighting will be limited to .08 watts per square foot.
- 23. Obtain Certified Survey Map approval for the 2220 Daniels Street property to clear up a land division issue.

Approval of this proposal does not include any approval to prune, remove or plant trees in the public right-of-way. Permission for such activities must be obtained from the City Forester, 266-4816. The trees shown in the street rights-of-way shall not be shown on the sign-off plan or construction plans unless they have previously been approved by the City Forester. If these are existing trees or species and locations that have been approved by the Forester, they shall be so labeled on plans.

Please follow the procedures listed below to receive your conditional use approval.

- 1. Please revise plans per the above conditions and submit twelve (12) sets of the final site plans (including drainage and landscaping plans) to the Zoning Administrator. The final plans are reviewed and approved by Traffic Engineering, Fire Department, City Engineering, and Zoning. Any of these agencies may call you to request additional information or to resolve problems.
- 2. This letter shall be signed by the applicant to acknowledge the conditions of approval and returned to the Zoning Administrator when requesting cover sheet approval.
- 3. No alteration of this proposal shall be permitted unless approved by the City Plan Commission provided, however, the Zoning Administrator may issue permits for minor alterations. This approval shall become null and void one year after the date of Plan Commission approval unless the use is commenced, construction is under way, or a valid building permit is issued and construction commenced within six months of the date of issuance of the building permit. See Section 28.12(11)(h)(3), Madison General Ordinances. The Plan Commission shall retain jurisdiction over this matter for the purpose of resolving complaints against this approved conditional use.
