### **Department of Energy**

Requirements/Guidelines



- Purpose Drive private capital into market
  - Requires a minimum 5:1 financial leverage
  - Ability to meet credit requirements for loans
- Develop a sustainable energy program
  - 6 years minimum
  - No income requirements
  - Residual program dollars retained by City



Shifting of funds over 10% - requires DOE approval






