### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

Hughes made a motion and a second by Hacker to approve the minutes from the 10-30-24 meeting. The motion was approved by a voice vote/other approved the motion.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

 86658 Discussion Regarding Merger of the Economic Development Committee and Vending Oversight Committee

The slide deck was reviewed and staff explained the history of the proposed committee merger between the Vending Oversight Committee (VOC) and the Economic Development Committee (EDC).

Committee members were in favor of the merger if it would mean a more efficient and effective way to complete the business each committee currently takes part in. Members had questions about number of members, make-up of the committee. Members wanted to ensure that small and micro businesses will still have a voice in the process and are not lost in the process.

Discussion was had on how the Technical Advisors would fit into the new structure. Members expressed the value they have on the discussion and decisions even if they are not voting members.

Staff will draft an Resolution to direct staff to begin the process to combine the two committees into a new committee.

3. Review and update State Street Night Vending site locations for the 2025-2026 season.

Staff reviewed the status to date of State Street Night Vending program and site placement. Staff observed and heard from vendors that the sites were too spaced out in the 700 block of State St. Staff identified four locations to move two of the sites closer to the three sites near Lake St. Staff will work with MPD on which sites will be selected. Staff were directed to decide on the sites and bring back to the February meeting for approval.

#### **DISCUSSION ITEMS**

4. 86864

Granger Hall expansion construction and Southeast Campus food cart relocation plan.

Staff reviewed the plans for the Granger Hall expansion. This will require 3 vending sites in Southeast Campus be eliminated from this area and relocated to a new location. The sites affected are U10, U11 and U12. These sites will come off line April 15, 2026. City staff and UW staff have identified a number of potential sites to test. Staff will work with the UW and other City agencies to select the new locations before April 15, 2026. A new site map will be adopted prior to this change.

#### **REPORTS**

5. <u>86858</u> Street Vending Staff Report

The Staff Report was reviewed. Alder Verveer stated he received a call from a cafe operator asking about changing the start date of Roadway Cafe licenses to coincide with the Start of the Dane County Farmers' Market and not the current annual start date of April 15. Currently Roadway Cafe licenses run April 15 - November 15 annually. Alder Verveer requested that this be a topic on a future agenda to review and hear from businesses that hold a Roadway Cafe license.
