





# 4. Project Information:

In 2005, the Overture Development Corporation purchased 100 N. Hamilton St. with the intent of transferring title to the Madison Children's Museum for development of a new museum to replace, improve and greatly expand upon the existing museum at its current location 100 State St. The project will renovate three floors of the building converting from general office to exhibits and operational spaces for the museum. It will also include construction of a publicly accessible roof top exhibit space. The buildings original flat iron entry facing the Capitol Square will be reactivated as the front door of the museum. The existing parking ramp will be improved to provide patron parking. A small addition will be added to the structure to accommodate stairs and an elevator as required by code for this public assembly use. Consistent with the culture of the Madison Children Museum, the building will incorporate many sustainable design and construction features. Building systems such as plumbing, HVAC and electrical, will be replaced.

Re: Letter of Intent

Please accept this document as our response to the Land Use Application, Madison Plan Commission, #5, Required Submittals, Letter of Intent.

The five-story building located 100 N. Hamilton St. was constructed in 1929 as a department store and later remodeled into offices. Our project will convert the building into a new home for the Madison Children's Museum (MCM) housing the entire operations (exhibits, shops, special function rooms and administration). In addition to interior renovations, the project will create roof-top exhibit spaces. When completed the building will allow the MCM to more than double exhibit spaces and improve visitor amenities. Previously deferred maintenance to the on-site parking ramp will be addressed within this project. This ramp provides parking on-site parking for patrons that is not available at the current location.

### I. Existing Conditions and Use Of Property

Prior to purchase, the building was used by the State of Wisconsin as general office space. Currently it is occupied by MCM's Administrative Staff and exhibits workshop. The remainder of the building is vacant.

Floor 1 Plan






Floor 2 Plan


