DRAFTER'S ANALYSIS: This ordinance would require the Treasurer to start charging a fee of not less than twenty-five (25) cents for every payment made to the City by electronic transfer of funds (ETF). The amount of this fee could be amended in subsequent budgets and the ordinance would not need to be amended so as to reflect such changes as any upward movement of the fee would still be consistent with the provision that this fee be not less than twenty-five (25) cents. This fee allows the City to recoup the costs of providing this service to those users who desire the convenience of paying fees and taxes through the internet.

Subsection (3) entitled "Electronic Payment Transaction Fee" of Section 4.05 entitled "Receiving of MoniesReceipt for Same" of the Madison General Ordinances is created to read as follows:

The Treasurer may accept payment by credit card, debit card or any other electronic payment mechanism of a fee or tax that is required to be paid to the City. The Treasurer shall decide which fees and/or taxes may be paid by credit card, debit card or any other electronic payment mechanism and the manner in which the payments may be made. If the Treasurer permits the payment of a fee or tax by credit card, debit card or any other electronic payment mechanism, the Treasurer may charge a transaction fee for each transaction in an amount of not less than twenty-five cents (\$0.25) United States Currency. The electronic payment transaction fee shall be amended from time to time, without amendment of this ordinance, if an increased fee is approved as part of the City Budget."
