Eventually, Krissy saved up enough money to move into her own place. She quickly regained full custody of her daughter, a huge sober goal of hers, and started a local chapter of Crystal Meth Anonymous in the community. She has remained a leader in all aspects of her life. She is incredibly supportive of others and the journey and serves as an example to all that hard work and dedication to your sober goals will pay off.

I am forever thankful to have Krissy as one of my dearest friends. She continues to succeed at all things she does and I can't wait to see her future!
