To: Property Owners along University Ave.

Re: Proposed Street Reconstruction & Utility Replacement Project & Public Hearing

The City of Madison is coordinating with the Wisconsin DOT and the Village of Shorewood Hills on a proposed reconstruction project on University Ave. Bidding of this project is scheduled for the fall of 2021, with construction scheduled to begin in early spring of 2022. Enclosed with this letter is a fact sheet with some details on the project, which includes a map of the project limits. Also enclosed is a notification for the Public Hearing before the Board of Public Works, which will be held virtually over Zoom. The date and time of the public hearing can be found on the notification, and, once available, links to register for the public hearing can be found at www.cityofmadison.com/clerk.

This project will involve special assessments to the owners of property adjacent to the project that are within the City of Madison (southerly side of University Ave.). Property owners will be assessed for various items included with this proposed project. This project has received federal funding to cover approximately 60% of the costs of the project, so the proposed assessments will only be for a portion of the City's share of the costs. A table detailing the assessment policy and cost sharing is also included on the fact sheet.

Also enclosed is a Schedule of Assessments, which shows the estimated costs for each property adjacent to the project. After the work is complete, a final assessment will be calculated based on bid prices and work actually performed. The final assessment, which will be billed the year following completion of construction, is payable in one lump sum or over a period of 8 years, with 2% interest charged on the unpaid balance.

To request accommodations for special needs or disabilities or if you have any other questions regarding this project, please contact the Project Engineer. This includes requests relating to the Public Hearing and also requests relating to the actual operations of construction. A list of contacts for this project can be found on the enclosed fact sheet.

That special assessments may be paid over an eight (8) year period, with the owner paying 1/8 of the principal each year plus two (2%) percent interest on the unpaid balance, as determined by the Board of Public Works.

That if the total assessment is paid in full before October 31st in the year that the billing is made, irrespective of project completion, then no interest shall be charged.

# Fact and Details Sheet: PROPOSED UNIVERSITY AVENUE RECONSTRUCTION

#### **Project Details – Proposed Work**

Sanitary Sewer: The existing sewer mains will be replaced with new PVC pipes, and the laterals will be replaced from the new main to the property line. Project is also being coordinated with MMSD to replace an interceptor sewer main within the project limits.

Water Main: The water mains will be replaced within the project limits and water services will be reconnected to the new main.

**Storm Sewer:** The existing storm sewer system along University Ave. will be replaced. Additionally, a new 96" storm sewer will be installed to provide some additional stormwater drainage capacity for the area.

Street: Replace all the existing pavements, curbs and gutters, and driveway aprons. New sidewalk will be installed along the north side of University Ave., and the sidewalk on the southerly side will be removed and replaced with a widened sidewalk (7'-10' wide) to provide improved pedestrian and bicycle access to those properties. The travel lane widths will be narrowed to provide additional space. University Bay will also be widened to allow for duel left turns off EB University Ave. A raised pedestrian crossing of the channelized right turn off SB University Bay will also be installed.

A new overpass will be installed over University Bay Dr. for the muti-use path. A separate connection will be installed from the path to the east side of University Bay Dr.

The street lighting and traffic signals will also be replaced with the project.

Trees: There are very few existing terrace trees along the southerly side, but these will all need to be removed for the widened sidewalk. The trees within the medians will also be removed within the project limits. Where possible, existing trees on the northerly side will be preserved.

Terrace Areas: Owners must remove any plantings, structures, or any special landscaping features from the terrace area and public Right of Way prior to the start of construction, including raised planting beds, stone landscaping, retaining walls, railings, pavers, planters, etc. If left in place, these items will be removed by the contractor and not replaced. With the project, the terrace areas will be restored either with topsoil and grass seed or concrete sidewalk, where appropriate.

Bus Stops: Bus pads will be installed at several locations including: far side (after cross street) in both directions at the Shorewood/Hill intersection, far side in both directions at the Marshall/Ridge intersection, on both sides of Franklin, just south of University Ave. Bus stops will remain at the Farley/University Bay intersection, and a new pull will be installed on University Bay, north of University Ave.

Assessments: After construction is complete, the assessments are recalculated based on the bid prices and measured quantities. The final assessments will be mailed in the summer of 2023, and, once received, property owners can pay the assessments in a lump sum or over 8 years with 2% interest.

#### **Construction Schedule & Impacts**

**Tentative Schedule:** This project is scheduled to be bid in late summer/early fall of 2021. Construction is expected to begin as soon as possible in the spring of 2022, likely in early March. The project is also being coordinated with private utilities (MG&E, AT&T, Charter, etc.), and work to relocate their facilities may start prior to the contractor on this reconstruction project. Construction is expected to be completed in November of 2022.

Traffic Impacts & Staging: The work on University Ave. will be completed in several stages. During each phase, University Ave. will remain open to 2 lanes of traffic in each direction, but, at times, it may be reduced to a single lane in one of the directions, during non-peak travel times. Each of the cross streets will be closed while work is taking place in those intersections, but University Bay will remain open to two-way traffic for the vast majority of the project, and access will also be maintained to old University Ave. There will be short weekend and/or night time closures of University Bay Dr. in order to complete some of the work on the utilities and the new overpass. Access will be maintained to all commercial driveways/parking lots, but there may be brief closures in order to complete work immediately in front of or on those driveways.

The first stage of the project will be to remove the existing medians and temporarily pave over those medians so that traffic can be maintained throughout construction. In general, the second stage of the project will be to construct the northerly half of University Ave. (traffic on the existing pavement on the southerly side), and the third stage of the project will be to construct the southerly half of University Ave. (traffic on the newly constructed north half).

Water Shut-offs: An average of two water shut-offs are expected for each property within the project limits. A minimum of 48 hours of notice will be provided prior to the shut-offs. Each shut-off may last up to 8 hours, but typically last about 4-5 hours. The existing main will remain in service until the new main is installed and connected to; emergency shut-offs may occur if the old, brittle main is damaged during construction.

Refuse & Recycling Collection and mail delivery: It will be the contractor's responsibility to allow for refuse and recycling collection to continue during construction, as well as mail delivery. Please mark your address on your City cart to make sure it is returned if moved. We ask that you place your carts at the street the evening prior to or at the very latest 6:00 a.m. on the morning of your scheduled refuse/recycling day. If you have a private collection service, please inform them of the pending road construction and that collections will generally need to take place from on the property.

## Supplemental Forestry Information

Street trees provide many benefits to our city and are considered an important part of the city's infrastructure. Forestry Section staff will evaluate the terrace for new planting sites and potential replacement sites when the project is complete. There is no additional cost to the adjacent property owner for a tree planting. Street trees are typically planted in the spring of the year following the completion of the construction project. Per Madison General Ordinance 10.10, City Forestry determines tree species and planting locations. Residents cannot choose or plant their own tree in the terrace.
