

Process to Assign or Change a Park Name or Assign or Change the Name of a Park Feature (Draft V2)



Notes:

- This process assumes the new parcel is not simply an addition to an existing named park. If it is, the new parcel will simply be named after the existing park. (Example is the new 30 acres recently added to Whitetail Ridge Park)
- The working name is used for park inventory and city assessor's office and will be used until the master planning process occurs for the park, and this could be a number of years.
- Working name could become the official name if no changes emerge during the master planning process review period.
- LRP will consider the name suggested by the staff and may suggest another name, they will recommend a name to the BPC.
- Public may recommend a name during the master planning process but they do not have the authority to approve one.
- The BPC will adopt the official name along with the master plan via the usual plan review and adoption process.
