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Hi Amy,

Here is a photo of the rear of the Social Justice Center - where the new mural will be. The awning would come down - for now - so we can do the work. I do not know if they will replace it or not. The mural will be painted directly on the wall, after the wall is appropriately tuck-pointed. The mosaic portion of the project will go on the lower unpainted cement portion.

As to the subject of the mural, it will be a celebration of life in the Willy Street neighborhood. We will invite family & friends of Tony Robinson, Paulie Heenan, and others with connections to the neighborhood who have died too young - mainly through violence - to submit images of their loved one in a happy moment - skate boarding, playing music, sitting on the front porch - for inclusion in the mural. The mural will have no images of violence - will have no RIP or other words suggesting death - just up-lifting moments that anyone in the neighborhood could have.

I will be project manager for the mural. Two lead artists will work with community members executing the mural. The painted portion will be lead by Kelty Carew - an outstanding visual artist who makes a living etching monuments. The SJC mural will be in good hands as Kelty is adept at working with grieving families - and helping them express themselves through art. The mosaic portion will be lead by my daughter Shadayra Kilfoy-Flores, who has done many mosaics - here in Madison and in Mexico - and is especially adept at working with teens. Wil-Mar teens, in particular, will be involved in both aspects of the mural - as will be Marquette neighborhood - and Willy St - folks who are looking for a positive way to express their feelings about recent events on Willy St.
