Dear Resident / Business Owner / Owner/Occupant,

The City of Madison Board of Public Works will hold a public hearing on the issue of allowing construction activities, with associated noise impacts, outside the period of 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM (10:00 AM to 7:00 PM on Sunday) for asphalt paving on the following streets:

On **WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 7, 2024 AT 5:30 PM** the Board of Public Works will hold a hearing on the issue of allowing construction work to take place outside the normal daytime construction hours. The Board of Public Works will be held remotely and the public can attend using a laptop or call in by phone. If you would like instruction on how to participate, please email boardofpublicworks@cityofmadison.com The Board will consider any objections that may be filed in writing or in person and hear all persons desiring to be heard.

Madison General Ordinance section 24.08 provides the Common Council the ability to allow construction activities outside of the hours of 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM (10:00 AM to 7:00 PM on Sunday) with the passage of a resolution and a hearing before the Board of Public Works.

The street listed above is scheduled for resurfacing in 2024. The first two phases include replacing deteriorated sections of curb and gutter and removing/milling the pavement. Phases one and two will be completed from 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM. Phases one and two can be performed around normal traffic volumes without adversely affecting the quality of the construction and without a big impact on traffic and business access.

The third phase includes placing the asphalt pavement. The work will take place on one or at most two nights. Phase three may be completed between 7:00 PM to 7:00 AM (7:00 PM to 10:00 AM on Sunday) for the following reasons:

1. Traffic turning in and out of the businesses and at the Beltline Hwy could adversely affect the newly placed asphalt pavement.
2. Access interruptions to businesses and the Beltline Hwy is greatly reduced.
3. Performing this work at a time when traffic volumes are reduced will produce a better product.
4. Safety
