To Whom It May Concern:

We have two items for consideration.

- 1. Our liquor license currently states that we cannot sell alcohol after 10 p.m. Since we close at 10 p.m. (and have no plans to change), this has not been an issue for us. However, we have two circumstances---which happen rarely---when it would help our business to be able to sell beer and wine until 12 midnight.
- a. When we close the shop to a private party. Currently, we have difficulty selling this service because customers cannot purchase alcohol after 10 p.m. We've hosted only 2 such parties in our entire existance, and would like to develop this offering better---especially during the summer when our regular sales go down.
- b. When we have special events that run past 10 p.m. Occasionally, an event (such as a film or acoustic performance) will run until 10:30 or 11:00 p.m. This happens once per month or less. We would like to be able to continue selling beer and wine on these minimal occasions.
- 2. We have been approved for an addition of a patio at the rear of our shop. This will be a private patio, completely enclosed by a tall fence. (Please see plans, attached.) We would like to extend our offering for beer and wine to the patio. We sell food all day until close, including waffles and hearty sandwiches. The patio will provide additional seating for our breakfast and lunch guests, and a pleasant atmoshpere for sipping coffee during the mornings. Our alcohol sales are a very small portion of our overall

earnings: about 3 per cent. We focus only on bottled microbrews and \$5 and \$6 glasses of wine, so we are not known as a place to "get cheap beer." We're hoping that adding this offering of beer and wine in an outdoor setting will help make us a destination for folks with mixed desires: some in a group might want coffee or chai, and someone else might want a glass of wine.
