**City of Madison Child Care Assistance
 Proposed 2017 Income Eligibility Guidelines**

3/2/2017

The City of Madison Child Care Assistance income eligibility guidelines are based on 185% of the federal poverty guidelines. The 2017 federal poverty guidelines were published on January 31, 2017 and the Child Care Assistance program is proposing to update the current eligibility guidelines accordingly.

These guidelines are used to both determine eligibility and in calculating a client’s assigned family share (co-pay). Applicants earning less than the established 185% FPG are eligible for and referred to Wisconsin Shares Child Care Subsidy program. Applicants earning more than the established guideline are generally assigned a weekly family share (co-pay).

Updating the guideline will decrease the families’ out of pocket cost and increase the City of Madison’s commitment to the currently enrolled families.

Below are the current 2016 guidelines and the proposed changes for 2017:
