-Approved ordinance changes to protect street trees. Thought a lot about Complete Green Streets during that, doesn't think it affects the overall decision of whether or not to keep a tree, but it does offer more protection for trees that are being kept (such as fines for contractors that damage trees, more protected area around the base, etc).
