As part of the Village at Autumn Lake Replat, Outlot 64 was dedicated to the Public for Stormwater Management and Drainage. The Developer, VAL, LLC, is responsible for the construction of stormwater management improvements within the outlot. The plan and contract was approved on December 13, 2024 by RES-24-00711, File No: 86065. Additional invasive tree removals are requested by the City for an area outside of the 75-foot drainage and stabilization limits for ecological restoration prior to the sale of lots adjacent to Outlot 64. The reimbursement up to \$25,000 for additional tree removals is the State Statutory Limit for reimbursement. Reimbursement shall be made payable to the Developer upon the City's acceptance of the Storm Greenway Improvements and project finalization.

The developer, Danisco USA, Inc., has been conditionally approved for a one-lot Certified Survey Map (CSM) to combine property located at 3322 Agriculture Drive and 5017-5025 Femrite Drive. The CSM anticipates future site and building improvements. The City has required dedication of land along the Femrite Drive frontage for and the construction of public sidewalk. Dedication of land along the west side of Agriculture Drive is also required to accommodate existing and recently constructed public sidewalk improvements. Currently, a north/south public storm sewer exists in an easement within the site. A proposed building requires the developer to grant a 25' wide Public Storm Sewer Easement to the City on the face of the pending CSM to accommodate the proposed public storm sewer to be relocated. The developer shall be responsible for the construction of the new public storm sewer in a location coordinated with and approved by the City of Madison. Existing public storm sewer and easement.
