Addendum to the City of Madison Community Development Block Grant Application

Demographic Numbers Clarification:

While our comprehensive databases record information such as race, gender, and location of residency of most individuals we provide services to through in-person education and outreach, we do not record all data the Demographics section of the application is seeking for every participant. Specifically, for 2011, as illustrated in the previous Demographics table:

- Under "Residency," we do not collect data the residency of all participants; numbers given reflect this (in this case, 329 with known residence locations out of 455 total participants)
- Under "Age," we do not collect data on the age of participants
- As we do not collect data on the race/ethnicity of all participants, under "Ethnicity,"
 the number of participants recorded who identify as Hispanic or Latino is three (3) out
 of a total of 137 participants where Race and Ethnicity are known. Therefore the
 number of participants identifying as "Not Hispanic or Latino" would be 134 (as
 opposed to the number currently reflected in the table)
- We do not collect information on either the number of participants or the number of staff identifying as persons with disabilities.
- The total number of unduplicated individual participants served during 2011 was 455.

Complaint and Testing Data for 2011:

Complaint Data

During the grant period, MMFHC conducted intake of complaints of housing discrimination, as described in Madison's Equal Opportunities Ordinance. These complaints alleged discrimination based on the following protected classes: race, sex, disability, age, familial status, marital status, lawful source of income including Section 8 rent assistance, and arrest or conviction record.

During the grant period MMFHC received a total of 50 complaints, alleging housing discrimination based on 67 protected classes, in Madison. Due to the complex nature of discrimination, some complaints were based on more than one protected class.

Testing Data:

During the grant period, MMFHC conducted a total of 19 tests investigating forms of illegal housing discrimination in Madison. Six of the tests were in response to complaints, and thirteen were systemic tests.
