Hello Tom,

Thank you very much for delivering the plan set last week. Again, I apologize for our having misplaced the materials you delivered previously. Based on what you provided last week, and on information from the National Register documentation and other information in our files, I offer the following comments pursuant to Wis. Stats. §§ 44.42 and 66.1111.

As designed, the proposed replacement bridge does not meet the Secretary of the Interior's "Standards" for treatment of a contributing element within a National Register-listed district. The replacement bridge ought to reflect the design of the original—simple lines, no "stone" embellishment, concrete construction with color as the original. Generally speaking, a very simple design is most appropriate in this case. The current replacement bridge appears as something trying to look historic, though no bridge of that design actually existed at that location. If you have original design/engineering details for the original concrete bridge, it could be appropriate to replicate that bridge. Otherwise, a simple concrete bridge, meeting your current needs, that stylistically is not exactly like the original, will suffice.
