2/25/08(?) Mr. Flaherty, 1115 Sherman, stopped in to discuss his driveway and access needs. We agreed to shorten the curbs in order to provide a more gentle grade on the drive apron to his property, and to insure that the abutting properties have access. The end of the block will become one large curb cut with a mountable curb, this will also prevent snow plow damage.
