SUBJECT: 2013 3rd Quarter Traffic Enforcement Activity Report

The information provided in this document represents the Madison Police Department's traffic enforcement activity for July through September 2013.

Traffic Citations

The Madison Police Department issued **5,234** traffic citations (**3,035**) citations were for hazardous violations and (**2,199**) citations were for non-hazardous violations in the 3rd quarter of 2013. These numbers reflect a decrease over the total number of citations (**6,635**) issued in the 3rd quarter of 2012. And somewhat fewer than the **6,192** citations that the Madison Police Department issued for the 3rd quarter of 2011.

T.E.S.T.

Of the **5,234** total citations issued, **2,211** citations (**1,205** hazardous and **1,006** non-hazardous) were issued by the Traffic Enforcement Safety Team in the 3rd quarter. These numbers represent a slight decrease in the total number of citations (**2,331**) issued by TEST officers during the 3rd quarter of 2012 and **2,005** citations in the 3rd quarter of 2011.

Speeding

3rd quarter 2013 citations for speeding totaled **1,372**. This is a decrease as compared with the **2,298** citations issued in the 3rd quarter of 2012, and a decrease than the **2,035** issued in the third quarter of 2011. This decrease is due to the midyear elimination of the WIDOT funded Speed and SMART grants.

Hazardous Violations

There were **3,035** citations issued for hazardous offenses during 3rd quarter 2013. This is a decrease of the **4,131** citations issued during 3rd quarter 2012.

Non-Hazardous Violations

There were **2,199** citations issued for non-hazardous offenses 3rd quarter 2013. This compares with **2,504** citations during 3rd quarter 2012.

During the 3rd quarter of 2013 we learned from WIDOT Bureau of Transportation Safety that 3 traffic enforcement grants awarded to the City of Madison for 2013 were eliminated midyear. These three grants were Seat Belt enforcement, speed enforcement and the SMART grant. Historically these grants were responsible for hundreds of citations. Although it is not certain, it is believed that the elimination of the grants has had a significant impact on traffic citations being issued. We have been in contact with WIDOT regarding 2014 grants and we are hoping that grant funding will return to the level that we have seen in recent years.

Traffic Complaint Hotline

The Traffic Complaint Hotline (previously known as the Speeders Hotline) received **329** citizen calls during the third quarter of 2013. **123** warning letters were sent as a result of reported violations.

School Zones

School zones violation reports from Crossing Guards resulted in **17** warning letters being sent and 11 citations issued for observed violations in the 3rd quarter of 2013.

Traffic Enforcement/Safety Grants

21 traffic enforcement overtime grant initiatives were scheduled for the 3rd quarter of 2013. These were coordinated through the Department of Transportation, Bureau of Transportation Safety. The grant initiatives focused on impaired driver (OMVWI), pedestrian and bike enforcement. In addition, the Madison Police Department participated in a multijurisdictional grant sponsored by the The Village of DeForest which focused on enforcement of traffic violations in participating municipalities in Dane County. These 9 grant initiatives included one in The City of Madison and eight in other Dane County jurisdictions resulted in 170 citations, and 690 warnings being issued. A total of 13 O.M.V.W.I arrests were made. It is obvious that the midyear elimination of the WIDOT funded Seat belt, Speed, and SMART grant has had a impact on citations issued. As of yet we have not heard how traffic grants will be awarded in 2014 from WIDOT.

Significant Crashes

In the third quarter of 2013, Traffic Specialists investigated **7** significant traffic crashes. These crashes resulted in **3** deaths and in significant (Great Bodily Harm) injury to 4 other. **5** of these crashes involved a pedestrian and 2 included a bicyclist. So far to date The City of Madison has experienced **7** fatality crashes these crashes have involved **5** pedestrians and **2** bicyclists.

Traffic enforcement is, and will remain a top priority of The Madison Police Department through the rest of 2013 and into 2014.
