#### Conceptual Approach

The impetus of this performance project came out of the concepts of Indigenous thrival and Indigenous well-being and celebration. We currently exist on Ho Chunk lands in Teejop (currently called Madison, WI), and we want to bring Native culture (represented by several diverse cultural traditions) into the public sphere as a space for Native people to gather, celebrate and share and as a space for non-Natives to come celebrate with us, learn and share.

#### Project Description (400 words or less)

Native peoples have relied on community care, support, and understanding to exist in what is now currently called North America, Wisconsin, and Madison since time immemorial. We have thrived in regions that now require extensive extraction and reliance on external resources. Thrival Tools brings together Indigenous methods of existence through food, art, and land sovereignty. Beginning locally, as the Madison Public Library system exists on Ho Chunk land, Ho Chunk stories and lifeways will be shared by a current health and wellness coordinator for the Ho Chunk Nation, Jon Jon Greendeer. Expanding to the largest Indigenous ethnic group in what is now Wisconsin, Biskakone Johnson (Lac Du Flambeau Ojibwe knowledge keeper and artist) will discuss treaty rights and food sovereignty through an Anishinaabe understanding. Shadayra Kilfoy-Flores, Madison local Chicana activist and Southern Indigenous educator will also join us and demonstrate how to make firecider to boost immunity and create warmth in the body. Anastasia Adams, Yup' ik educator and performer, will close the evening with traditional Inuit throat singing utilized as entertainment and survival during long northern winters. The Inuit are an ethnic supergroup living in what is now called Alaska, Canada, and Greenland. There will be time for question and answer potions, attendee participation during throat singing. and hands-on activities as available with the pandemic. The evening will begin with a Ho Chunk welcome song and end with a traveling song from the Madtown Singers Native drum group. The inclusion of the Madtown Singers drum group is important and indicative of Indigenous thrival and celebration as we are here honoring the land, our ancestors, and current and future generations.
