Ald. Harrington-McKinney's Notes from September 27, 2019 Neighborhood Meeting Regarding the Proposed Development at 1848 Waldorf Boulevard

Concerns Expressed by Residents:

- Parking illegally in Promontory parking spot
- Come to Council meeting & talk to the Council meeting
- Thought: have fewer units some with more bedrooms, like 3 bedroom units
- Open to negotiation on parking
 - (Applicant team): Talking to vet clinic re: shared parking
- Traffic flow & congestion
- "What value does this bring to the neighborhood?"
 - o "It's a desirable area. We want more people to enjoy the area"
- Question (from resident): "Can you do condos owner-occupied?" "Would you consider owneroccupied condos instead of apartments?"
 - Response (from applicant team): "I can't do that now because it doesn't correlate to current business plan. Maybe in 3-5 years."
- Question (from resident): "When will we hear from you?"
 - Response (from applicant team): "We will meet. We will set up an email chain within the next 10 days. I will be back to you. We will have another community meeting. We can meet here.
- Noise during construction!
- Construction dynamics!
- "Lower salability of my unit!"
- Parking
- "Losing my green space, yoga spot, place to walk the dog" (agreed by other tenant)
- Height of the building; number of floors!

Additional Comments/Concerns Added by Meeting Attendees:

- Consider a green roof i.e. designer adds plants or grass on the roof so that it looks appealing
- Concerned that the size of the buildings are not a good fit for the size of the lots
- Parking is a major concern = "spillover". Residents already encountering this without the new building!!
- Parking is not sufficient to prevent Waldorf parking or use of Tiberon & Promontory.
- Shared cost of road maintenance on adjacent roads
- Traffic
- Dangerous on access road in limited space with entrance/exit, with all the garages
- Privacy
- Sunlight
- For tenants dangerous, dirty, pollution, noise

Concerns noted by Kirk Biodrowski at the September 27, 2018, neighborhood meeting about Midtown Reserve:

- 1. Will Midtown share in the plowing/ maintenance of the access road?
- 2. Parking:
 - a. Can more be added to the site?
 - b. Will vet clinic allow shared parking on their site?
- 3. What to do about construction noise during the construction of the building?
- 4. Where are the staging areas for construction equip on the site?
- 5. Can the building height be lowered?
- 6. Location of the building relative to the property line and to Promontory condos

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
