

## **Farmland Preservation Task Force Background Information 10/26/22**

### **Zoning Code Re-write (2012)** Madison General Ordinances provide for

- Community Gardens (produce may not be sold, sizes vary) permitted in residential, commercial, employment, mixed use & other districts
- Market Gardens (produce may be sold, size not specified) permitted in Special Districts below, otherwise conditional
- Urban Agriculture Special District (produce may be sold, 15k square feet) MGO 28.093
- Agriculture Special District (produce may be sold, 5 acres) MGO 28.092
