

# 2015 Dane County Early Childhood Education Demographic Report

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Enrollment data is from March 2015. Enrollment data below does <u>not</u> include numbers from unregulated public/private school preschool or after school programs- those are covered later in the report. Wisconsin Shares enrollment covers only children from Dane County. **The large change between preschool and school age children is the result of reclassifying 5 year olds as school age** as opposed to preschool. School age programs had a slight increase in enrollment.

Overall enrollment was flat. There was again a slight drop in enrollment under Wisconsin Shares. The number of children in high quality accredited programs was flat while capacity increased. A chart covering unlicensed public and private school programs for children under age six is on page 2 of this report. 25% of the preschool enrollment in state licensed child care is currently funded at least partially by the public schools.

Overall there is an estimated 1856 empty slots (about 10% of total capacity) in regulated family child care, full day group centers and school age programs in Dane County., This is slightly more than last year.

After years of decline, family child care saw an increased enrollment this year including in certified and provisional family child care. Overall child care enrollment indicates that Dane County is coming out of the recession. Cost was a major deterrent to using regulated care indicated by parents in a small 4-C study in 2012 though the study also indicated that educated millennial parents wanted to spend more time with their children and thus use child care less.

In this report there may be some minor variations in total enrollments between some of the different geographic charts involving the City of Madison. This is usually due to the fact that census tracts and neighborhood planning areas vary and often include areas outside the city. In some cases the data can be limited to just the city of Madison and in others the data cannot. Throughout this report there are references to Wisconsin's YoungStar quality rating and improvement system for child care programs, including an analysis of the number of programs at each of the various quality star ratings in each zip code in Dane County. An explanation of YoungStar is on page 21.

## Public School Programs in Dane County for Children under Age Six 2014-2015

Public Schools in Dane County increasingly are providing additional programs for children under age 6. These include: pre-kindergarten programming for children at risk (listed on the chart as preK); regular kindergarten for children age 5 (5K), usually offered in a full day format; and 4 year old kindergarten (4K). There are also private schools offering both 4K and kindergarten which are exempt from state licensing.

Publicly funded 4 year old kindergarten (4K), usually offered as a part day program, is offered in all Dane County school districts. The models for it vary from district to district. Depending on the district, it can be either in the local public schools or by subcontract in various state licensed child care centers, preschools or head start programs. The arrangements for the latter vary from district to district. Quite often the district provides the state certified teachers but in some situations the state certified teacher is on the staff of the center.

The data in the following chart is taken from the 2014-2015 public and private school annual enrollment report on the Wisconsin Department of Instruction Website. It is presented by school district not municipality. 4k data is presented in total for each district but also split between in public school and in licensed programs categories. The 4k enrollment data for state licensed programs is included as part of the preschool numbers in the other charts within this report. The in school 4k data, the Kindergarten and pre-K numbers represent children in programs but which are not included in the other charts in this paper which are limited to state regulated programs outside the public schools. If you add in the public and private school preschool numbers to the total in regulated care there are 13,659 children in some type of preschool program in Dane County (and that does not include 5,531 five year olds in school kindergartens). These figures need to be considered when planning additional preschool care or early childhood programs. See chart on page 7 for zip code analysis.

Learning Environment and Curriculum - When teachers and caregivers create meaningful experiences for children, they are more likely to have long-term school and life success.

**Business and Professional Practices** - How programs do business matters. Well-respected, fairly-compensated professionals, who are actively maintaining professional standards and business practices and engaging families, are better able to respond to meet the needs of children and their families.

**Health and Wellness** - Children grow up in the context of their families, communities, and culture. These standards look at the outcomes of the whole child from nutrition and physical activity to meeting special needs and being responsive to how kids form relationships.



Excess Capacity is the difference between regulated capacity and total enrollment. It may underestimate the number of available slots due to some children attending part time-part time programs are included in the enrollment and capacity totals. Some Madison census tracts boundaries are different from City of Madison boundaries which is why the totals for this chart sometimes differ from totals for the City of Madison based on actual boundaries used elsewhere in this report.
