Unlike most music festivals, which take over a park or arena, MMM brings music to the people with 284 performances at 110

different locations. They range from the expected to the unexpected.

Here are 10 performances we're looking forward to today:

### **11 a.m., SpareTime Bluegrass Band, Dane County Regional Airport Check-in Area**

Who needs the soothing sounds of music more than weary travelers? MMM has a stage near the check-in area at the airport open from 11 a.m. to 9 p.m., beginning with the popular bluegrass band.

### **1 p.m., Mass Appeal Fiddlers, 30 on the Square, 30 W. Mifflin St.**

30 of Madison's finest fiddlers will pick up a bow for an early afternoon outdoor show at the top of State Street outside Ian's Pizza.

### **4 p.m.-8 p.m., Fire Station Grand Pianos**

Fire stations 3 (1217 Williamson St.) 6 (825 West Badger Road), 9 (201 N. Midvale Blvd.) and 10 (1517 Troy Drive) will have pianos sitting out front for any passersby to sit down and play.

### **4 p.m., Wadoma, Wisconsin Historical Museum, 30 W. Carroll St.**

West African Dance of Madison will take over the streets outside the museum.

**4:30-9, Solskinn, Elvehjem Park, 1202 Painted Post Drive**

Local promoters Jonk Music is celebrating the summer solstice with a free evening of music featuring Julian Lynch, The Luyas, Icarus Himself and more.

**4:30 p.m., Benjamin David Kerns, Train Car E, 640 W. Washington St.**

All aboard for hip-hop as Kerns rhymes in one of the parked railroad cars off of W. Washington Ave.

**5 p.m., Forward Marching Band, Yahara River**

They won't be marching so much as floating, as the band heads up and down the Yahara serenading folks on the shore, later docking at Tenney Beach for a full concert.

**6 p.m., Mass Appeal Harmonicas, 30 on the Square, 30 W. Mifflin St.**

Hohner Harmonicas is giving 100 harmonicas to ordinary folks, and then Madison harmonica man DeWayne Keyes will lead the harmonica choir in a performance.

**7 p.m., V05, Bear Mound Park, 1524 Vilas Ave.**

Madison's furry, fuzzy, glammy dance band plays King of the Disco Mountain in the Vilas neighborhood.

**7 p.m. Mass Appeal Drumming, Madison Urban League, 2222 S. Park St.**

Bring a drum to the Urban League and join a parade of percussionists to Penn Park for a massive drum circle, led by Rockameem Bell.
