Urban Design Commission Resubmittal:

This letter accompanies the redesigned Southeast corner of the Veterinary Specialty Options facility as requested from the July 12th, 2006 Plan Commission Meeting. As stated in the meeting notes:

Approval recommended subject to the comments and conditions contained in the Plan Commission materials and the following condition: - That this development return to the Urban Design Commission prior to recording of the PUD-SIP so that the UDC can revisit the elevations of the southeast corner of the building to ensure that the building will relate as well as possible to the adjoining streets.

Following this letter we have provided two alternative design scenarios (Labeled A & B) that will help this building better relate to the corner of adjoining streets Waldorf Boulevard and Midtown Commons Road. Both of these alternatives should activate the corner while in keeping with both the building's language and use. We believe both scenarios are equally strong and would gladly use the option which best solves the above-mentioned design issue.
