Madison Arts Commission

The City of Madison (MAC) recognizes the unique value of the arts and the contribution they make to the quality of life within our community. Madison Arts Commission was created by ordinance in 1974, to advise the Mayor, Common Council and city agencies on matters which relate to the creation, presentation and funding of public art.

Conceptual Approach

During my residency at Garver Canvas I will work on a new, large-scale sculptural piece to be debuted at Femmfestival on Feb. 19th. I will aim to create an experience that focuses on awakening the community to their inner voice and trusting that voice with the goal of positive action from our inherent knowledge. By allowing the community to view my creative process and interact with me while I work (during my open-studio residency) I hope the audience will have a greater understanding of the final piece.

Project Description (400 words or less)

Inspired by the human form, the final piece will be displayed hanging from the beams in Garver Feed Mill's large, main space. The central form will have a textile backdrop representing our "centre" - the unexplainable place from where our true knowledge stems and the place I believe we need to access to bring our community to a place of union and progress. This inner knowing was honored by ancient cultures who achieved incredible structures by working together (without scissor lifts!) Additional textiles and materials will radiate from the form and its centre as if unraveling and spreading. This material will feature a grayscale ombre representing the release of inner darkness. With a new found flow of knowledge, positive waves impact our lives and those around us and things shift. The project is not only meant to "wow" the audience but to convey the higher knowledge/heart intelligence within all of us, waiting to be accessed and create a stronger self and community. I hope the piece will evoke an emotional response from the 1000+ visitors who will have free access to the piece throughout its exhibition. The piece will debut on Feb 19 and will remain on display for at least one week after the festival and up to 3 weeks depending on the event schedule in the space. Garver Events is supplying the scissor lift needed for install and deinstall. Onsite Garver Events staff will be available to assist with installation and deinstallation.
