Action Text: Yolanda Shelton-Morris gave a presentation on the staff funding recommendations.

A motion was made by Arvina Martin, seconded by Consuelo Lopez to only fund organizations that submitted complete applications according to the posted guidelines, and exclude any applications that were late or incomplete. This would remove Freedom, Inc.'s application from eligibility. Motion passed by voice vote.

A motion was made by Brian Benford, seconded by Shiva Bidar to fund the eight agencies that scored the highest points in the staff proposal scores. The top 6 would get \$100,000 each (Centro Hispano, End Abuse/Rise Law Center, Latino Workforce Development, Catholic Multicultural Center, Literacy Network, Vera Court Neighborhood Center) and the next 2 would get \$50,000 each (African Center for Community Development, RISE Wisconsin)

A SUBSTITUTE motion was made by Shiva Bidar, seconded by Brian Bendford to approve the following funding recommendations totaling \$550,000:

- Centro Hispano: \$150,000
- Catholic Multicultural Center-\$50,000
- Vera Court Neighborhood Center-\$75,000
- African Center for Community Development-\$100,000
- RISE Wisconsin, Inc.-\$50,000
- Community Immigration Law Center-\$100,000
- Rainbow Project-\$25,000

Motion passed by voice vote.

A motion was made by Bridget Rogers, seconded by Brian Benford to recommend \$149,463 in funding for Latino Academy for Workforce Development.

A friendly amendment was proposed by Brian and agreed to by Bridget that Latino Academy of Workforce Development should get \$150,000. Motion passed by voice vote with Shiva Bidar recusing herself.

A motion was made by Brian Bendford, seconded by Michelle Dunphy to approve the complete funding package passed in the last two motions and instruct staff to submit a substitute resolution with their recommendations to be approved by Finance Committee and Common Council.

Body

Body

The proposed resolution allocates up to \$700,000 for grants to 8 community non-profit agencies to help finance their provision of services to support undocumented immigrant residents beginning March 15, 2022. Funding for these grants is included in City’s 2022 Adopted Operating Budget and draws on one-time federal funds from the State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds component of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).

The Community Development Division used a competitive application process to develop recommendations to allocate funds that were authorized in the 2022 Adopted Operating Budget, for use beginning in 2022. The allocation of ARPA funds for this specific use was authorized by the Common Council on July 12, 2021, through enactment of RES-21-00487 (Legistar File 65935) to support operating costs associated with immediate needs in the community.

The goal of this funding is to support community partners in their work delivering direct assistance to undocumented immigrant individuals and families to help them cope with the consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic.

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has, and continues to, cause widespread economic and social disruption both locally and across the country; and,

WHEREAS, the City’s 2021 Adopted Operating Budget was amended to appropriate a total of \$700,000 in State and Local Fiscal Recovery funds, to be administered by the Community Development Division (CDD), to support community-based organizations serving undocumented residents; and,

WHEREAS, on July 12, 2021, the Common Council adopted RES-21-00487 (Legistar File 65935) which directed CDD to conduct a funding process to solicit proposals from organizations that deliver direct assistance to undocumented individuals and families as they cope with the consequences of COVID-19; and,

WHEREAS, RES-21-00487 also directed the CDD to formulate funding allocation recommendations to the Mayor and Common Council, for their approval, prior to awarding contracts to selected agencies; and,

WHEREAS, on January 10, 2022, the CDD released application guidelines for proposals, with an application due date of January 28, 2022, and received proposals from 15 organizations; and,

WHEREAS, utilizing the criteria set forth in the application guidelines, CDD staff evaluated proposals and presented funding recommendations for consideration by the Community Services Committee: and,

WHEREAS, after receiving public comment from applicants, and considering recommendations from CDD staff, the Community Services Committee, on February 23, 2022, acted to recommend to the Common Council the award of funds to the following organizations at the specified amounts:

African Center for Community Development, Inc.	\$100,000
Catholic Multicultural Center, Inc.	\$50,000
Centro Hispano, Inc.	\$150,000
Community Immigration Law Center, Inc.	\$100,000

Latino Academy for Workforce Development, Inc.	\$150,000
The Rainbow Project, Inc.	\$25,000
Rise Wisconsin, Inc.	\$50,000
Vera Court Neighborhood Center, Inc.	\$75,000

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Common Council approves the funding allocations to support services to undocumented immigrant residents as detailed above and finalized by the Community Services Committee; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Common Council authorizes the Mayor and City Clerk, on behalf of the City, to execute agreements with the above listed agencies, to accomplish the purposes set forth in this resolution.
