The Consortium may also itself conduct complaint investigations if at least one member purchases the products made in the factory in question. Investigations may vary in scope and extent, depending on the problems identified and the needs of member agencies. All Consortium-sponsored investigations are conducted by member-approved independent monitoring groups or directly by staff in simple fact finding cases.
