4 25013 CDA EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Erdman reviewed the Executive Director's report (attached to minutes).

5 25012 MOSAIC RIDGE UPDATE & DISCUSSION

5a Joint Venture Partner

- CDA may want to consider providing construction financing.
- Would ask the Council if we could use the developer fee to roll back into the homes or to assist the buyers.
- Beginning to put structure in place.
- Finalizing the selection of Kegonsa Builders.
- Working with lenders.

5b Discussion of possible funding opportunity

Erdman provided an update on the recent RFP for the Affordable Housing Trust Fund:

- A \$3.0 million fund.
- May assist units to maintain long-term affordability.
- Target at or below 80% of Median.
- Mosaic Ridge meets one out of the three criteria.
- Price range from \$150,000 to \$175,000.
- \$60,000 maximum per unit amortized over ten years at 2.75%.
- Must stay within the maximum purchase price limit, be energy efficient and kept income-restricted for 30 years. Members expressed concerns that 30 years were too long for the restricted period and would be a deterrent to buyers. Staff will check and see if there is any flexibility in this rule.

5c 25548 Home Buyer Education and Readiness Update

Erdman provided the update.

- Contract with GreenPath in place.
- Will be working on identifying two residents to test the screening procedure.
