These initiatives include the Streetcar Study, Transport 2020 Implementation, Metro services expansion to other communities, the Downtown Comprehensive plan, and improved bicycling resources."

6) One committee member shall be designated as an alternate on the committee.

7) The final report shall be referred to the Downtown Coordinating Committee prior to final consideration by the City Council.

#### 6. OLD BUSINESS-Halloween

The medium prices in 1998-2004 average sale price were \$189,600, whereas the active price is \$319,900, or an increase of 61%.
