## PARKS STAFF RECOMMENDS APPROVAL PROVIDED THE SPONSOR COMPLIES WITH THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS.

- 1. Aldermanic notification (already done).
- 2. Sponsor will provide a complete site map for the park to Parks Staff once all plans are set.
- 3. Sponsor will arrange a site plan meeting, at least two weeks in advance, with the West Parks Supervisor, and agrees to any and all site recommendations he will make.
- 4. Fees will be paid at least one week prior to the event.
- 5. Sponsor will post a \$3,000 damage deposit with the Parks Division prior to the event and acknowledges that this organization will be responsible for any and all actual field renovation costs which may result from this event.
- 6. Sponsor will provide a certificate of insurance covering this event, and naming the City of Madison as "additional insured."
- 7. Sponsor understands that no parking on the grass will be allowed by staff or participants.
- 8. Sponsor understands that glass containers are not allowed in the park, and will convey this to participants.
- 9. Sponsor will have volunteers to empty trash barrels throughout the event and will be responsible for full clean-up of the park after the event.
- 10. In connection with the placement of the tents, Digger's Hotline must be called approximately ten days in advance, and the ticket number then relayed to the Park Office.
- 11. Sponsor will be responsible for the ordering, placement, removal, and payment for all portable toilets and hand-washing stations needed for this event.
- 12. Sponsor will employ overnight security for the park for the duration of the event.
- 13. Sponsor will apply for a Street-Use Permit (already done) and will work with the Street-Use Staff Team members on issues relating to street closure, parking restrictions, and drop-off areas.
- 14. Sponsor will work with the Capitol City Band, which is already scheduled to use the park on Thursday, July 29, to enable it to hold its weekly concert at Rennebohm Park.
