This document MUST BE POSTED by the CONTRACTING AGENCY in at least one conspicuous and easily accessible place on the site of the project. A local governmental unit may post this document at the place normally used to post public notices if there is no common site on the project. This document MUST remain posted during the entire time any worker is employed on the project and MUST be physically incorporated into the specifications and all contracts and most subcontracts. The following statutory provisions apply to local governmental unit public works projects and are set forth below pursuant to the requirements of s. 66.0903 (8), Stats.

Each contractor, subcontractor or agent thereof performing work on a project that is subject to this section shall keep fu and accurate records clearly indicating the name and trade or occupation of every person described in sub. (4) and an accurate record of the number of hours worked by each of those persons and the actual wages paid therefor.

Any contractor, subcontractor or agent thereof, who fails to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub.(3) or who pays less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailin hours of labor determinded under sub.(3), shall be liable to any affected employe in the amount of his or her unpaid wag or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and in an additional equal amount as liquidated damages. An action to rece the liability may be maintained in any court of competent jurisdiction by any employe for and in behalf of that employe a other employes similarly situated. No employe may be a party plaintiff to any such action unless the employe consents writing to become such a party and the consent is filed in the court in which the action is brought. Notwithstanding s. 814.04 (1), the court shall, in addition to any judgment awarded to the plaintiff, allow reasonable attorney fees and co to be paid by the defendant.
