This is the first year enrollment has increased since 2006. Most of the increase can be attributed to the Madison Schools instituting a 4 year old kindergarten program and subcontracting a portion of the program to existing accredited early childhood programs. The above chart does not include public school kindergarten enrollment, pre kindergarten at risk programs or on school site public school 4 year old kindergarten programs. The public school enrollment data for the 2011-2012 school year shows 9811 children in these programs. With 4K subcontracts or out placement to regulated child care programs in the community there is some duplication between that data and the 4C survey data. However that still indicates that the number of preschool children in programs funded by the public school almost equals the total preschool enrollment funded by private tuition in state regulated early childhood programs. This is a major change in the delivery of education to preschool children in the county .

Family child care also saw a slight increase enrollment this year indicating possibly the slowing of the decline in the number of regulated homes in Dane County. Part Day Preschools saw another major drop in enrollment. Further analysis will need to be done to determine if this is an actual decrease or a category shift as some part day programs are adding hours and becoming full day child care programs with preschool components. While employment in Dane County has been improving, the effects of the recession are still being felt in the child care field. Cost was a major deterrent to using regulated care indicated by parents in a small 4-C study in 2012. This problem is aggravated by the fact the Wisconsin Shares reimbursement rate has been frozen since 2006 and increasingly is reimbursing on an hourly basis not normally used in Dane County. The losses sustained by programs serving children on Shares subsidies are covered by increasing rates overall. This further discourages the use of regulated child care programs by parents who pay full tuition.

This report is used extensively by programs to plan services. As such there will be some minor variations in terms of total enrollments between some of the different geographic charts involving the City of Madison. This is usually due to the fact that census tracts and even neighborhood planning areas vary and often include areas outside the city. Since it is useful for child care programs to know how many children are enrolled nearby, existing boundaries for tracts are used instead of correcting them to end at the city's borders.

**Child Care and Early Childhood Education In Madison
A Neighborhood Analysis March 2012**

A major problem with planning for early childhood programs in the City of Madison has been the difficulty in analyzing the use of child care for geographic levels lower than a zip code. Zip codes are often too large to provide very useful data about specific neighborhood areas. They also often overlap major roads and other barriers that define natural boundaries between communities.

Thanks to a small grant in 2010 from the City of Madison , 4-C, with the help of the University of Wisconsin Population Lab was able to code all of the child care providers by census tract and Neighborhood Planning District. This enables a far more detailed analysis of where programs serving young children are within the city.. The neighborhood planning district coding should make it easier to integrate early childhood into local planning processes as well as assist those local neighborhood organizations interested in programs for children. Census tracts occasionally overlap city borders – in those cases the enrollment totals include the area outside the city- those tracts are marked with a 1 in the Portions Outside column.

Explanation of the charts :

A map for the census tract areas is attached – unfortunately there is no similar map available currently for the Neighborhood Planning Districts. All data relates to programs regulated under state law in March 2012.

Infant – Toddler. is the count of children under 2 in early childhood programs in March 2012.

Preschool is the count of children age 2 through age 5 in early childhood programs in March 2012.

School Age is the count of children 6 years old or older in early childhood programs in March 2012.

2011 Enrollment is the total number of children enrolled in March 2011

Change is the difference between total enrollment in March 2011 and March 2012
