Hi Steve.

Thank you for sharing your concern about idling police vehicles. I believe a representative from the Madison Police Department will be reaching out to you (if they haven't already) to explain their policy to limit unnecessary idling. My understanding is that they do not condone leaving a vehicle running when no one is inside. From a fleet maintenance perspective, we agree that stopping idling is important to reduce the wear and tear on the engine, and then there's the environmental and economic impact of wasting fuel. Idling truly is a concern, and I appreciate you bringing this up for discussion.

Most police vehicles have extra electrical equipment (computer, camera, radio, lights, etc.), and they need to have the engine running to use that equipment when they're working in the field or on a scene. Anything we can do to increase the fuel-efficiency of the vehicles themselves is helpful. We are working with the Police Department to increase the hybrid and electric vehicles in their fleet. Currently, they have over 100 hybrid vehicles and 18 electric vehicles, with more on the way.

I also want to clarify one point about the engine hours listed on the auction examples you included. The engine hour meter tracks how long an engine is running, which includes when it's physically driving down a road. A good rule of thumb is to estimate 30 miles driven per engine hour, so you can use that to calculate a better estimate of the true idle time for an engine.
