## RESOLUTION 2006-02 A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE REMOVAL OF THE TEMPORARY BARRICADES FROM COLDSPRING AVENUE.

WHEREAS, the City of Madison had allowed the placement of temporary barricades on Coldspring Avenue in an attempt to stem traffic concerns on that roadway, and

WHEREAS, the barricades were placed without due regard to the safety of the students of the Monona Grove School District, and

**WHEREAS**, without proper access emergency response is greatly impaired to the pupils of the Monona Grove School District, and

WHEREAS, the City of Madison has not provided sound planning by placing these barricades on the roadway, and

WHEREAS, the Madison Common Council will be considering a resolution authorizing a permanent placement of said barricades.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Village of Cottage Grove supports the resolution recently adopted by the City of Monona and understands the concerns as brought to the Village Board by residents.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Village of Cottage Grove Board of Trustees does hereby register in opposition to any permanent placement of barricades on Coldspring Avenue by the City of Madison for the following reasons: (1) the barricades create impediments for public safety; (2) the barricades lack sound engineering design; and (3) problems effecting multiple municipalities should not be resolved through the unilateral actions of one municipality.
