RE: 2026 Liquor License Renewal Separations: Refuel Pantry All Madison Locations

Refuel Pantry has 14 Madison locations. All fourteen licenses are separated due to an incident that occurred at the 605 Cottage Grove Road location in which the establishment sold THC edibles to middle school children, some of them 12 years of age. The children had bad reactions to the edibles, vomiting, dizziness, etc., which is how Madison Police became involved. Some of the children were transported by EMS to the hospital. Madison Police visited 605 Cottage Grove Road shortly after the edible incident to see if there was a licensed operator on site, and there was no licensed operator on site.

These two law violations resulted in ACA Zilavy contacting Department of Alcohol Beverages agent Nicole Zautner to have her inspect the remaining locations to see if they were in compliance with basic licensing requirements such as having a licensed operator on premises. Agent Zautner inspected the following locations and found additional violations:

- 4601 Verona Road – various administrative violations
- 699 S. Whitney Way – no licensed operator
- 699 S. Gammon Road – no licensed operator
- 6702 Mineral Point Road – no licensed operator
- 3101 N. Sherman Avenue – various administrative violations
- 3019 E. Washington Avenue – various administrative violations
- 6410 Millpond Road – no licensed operator

To my knowledge, Agent Zautner has been unable to visit the remaining six (6) locations as of this date due to her workload.
