5. 83091

Amending Section 25.09 of the Madison General Ordinances related to Chronic Nuisance Premises: (1) to make it easier to declare a Chronic Nuisance Premises when the nuisance activity involves firearms and/or serious bodily injury or death, and shortening the period for declaring a Chronic Nuisance Premises based on nuisance activities not involving firearms or serious bodily injury or death; (2) adding a section to exempt certain victim-centered offenses such as domestic violence, from eligible nuisance activities; (3) administrative and reorganization of some subsections for easier comprehension.
