Per Madison Police Department, Walsh Rd and Sycamore Ave should be posted as no parking for this event so that runners do not need to use the lane of traffic at all.

Other than the race itself, all other aspects of this event (vendors, portable toilets, etc) will be on private property at The Boneyard.

STREET EVENT CLEAN-UP AND RECYCLING PLAN

Trash cans will be located at the one aid station that will be along the course. Volunteers will fully clean up that area after the last participant passes.

Volunteers will also remove all event signage at approx. 12pm, once all participants are off of the course, and will look for any garbage, recycling, or unwanted items along the course.

The remainder of the event will take place at The Boneyard and will utilize their existing trash and recycling receptacles.

Accessibility



ACCESSIBILITY PLAN

Events permitted in the City of Madison are required to have an accessibility plan. The scope and details of the accessibility plan depend on the scope and details of the event. The accessibility plan could include the following:

- Accessible parking spots which include temporary access aisles where needed (indicated on event site map).
- Accessible path of travel from parking or drop-off areas, as well as throughout event to any area accessible to the general public.
 - An accessible path of travel connects all elements and is at least 36" wide.
- Accessible communication plan (must include opportunity for request of interpreters, multiple ways to access festival information)
 - Interpreters must be booked but can be cancelled if organizers do not receive RSVPs from the deaf community 72 hours prior to the event.
 - At a minimum, schedules should be in print and accessible to screen readers electronically.
- Accessibility features included in advertising materials (websites and fliers) at least 2 weeks in advance of event. Possible information to include:
 - Accessible parking locations
 - Accessible seating locations
 - Accessible restrooms
 - Available interpretation services
 - Available quiet areas
- Cluster portable toilets in groups of no more than 6, and ensure at least one accessible portable toilet per cluster of portable toilets.
- Provide an ADA seating area to ensure access for people who need it.
- Maintain accessible path to, and within, all temporary structures
- Contacting parking enforcement regarding vehicles illegally parked in temporary accessible stalls.

Accessible parking spaces will be located in The Boneyard parking lot, and we will promote to attendees that accessible parking will be available there.

There is already an accessible restroom in the building.

The 5K and 1 mile course will be primarily on the shoulders of the road, sidewalks, and bike path, which all be accessible. We will encourage registered participants to reach out if they have any questions or needs related to the course.

EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN (EAP)

I. GENERAL

The "Fetch 5K Dog Jog" will be held Sunday, September 24th, 2023 at The Boneyard, 1018 Walsh Road, Madison, WI 53714.

II. PURPOSE

- A. This emergency action plan predetermines actions to take before and during the "Fetch 5K Dog Jog" (hereinafter referred to as the event) in response to an emergency or otherwise hazardous condition. These actions will be taken by organizers, management, personnel, and attendees. These actions represent those required prior to the event in preparation for and those required during an emergency.
- B. Flexibility must be exercised when implementing this plan because of the wide variety of potential hazards that exist for this event. These hazards include, but are not limited to, Fire, Medical Emergencies, Severe Weather, or situations where Law Enforcement is required.

III. ASSUMPTIONS

The possibility of an occurrence of an emergency is present at this event. The types of emergencies possible are various and could require the response of Fire & Rescue, Emergency Medical Services, and Police.

IV. BASIC PLAN

A. Emergency Action Plan (EAP) Event Representative

- 1. The EAP event representative will be identified as the point of contact for all communications regarding the event. This person is identified as PRIMARY CONTACT: Amber Wiza.

B. Emergency Notification

- 1. In the event of an emergency, notification of the emergency will be through the use of 911. The caller should have the following information available to the 911 operator: nature of emergency, location, and contact person with callback number.
- 2. We will / will not have on-site EMS ()
- 3. We will / will not have on-site Police or Security (Per communication with Jennifer Hannah and Michael Ott from Madison Police Department, on-site police is not required if we have course marshalls in hi-vis vests for the street crossing on Walsh Rd, and post Sycamore Ave and Nakoosa Trail as no parking for the portions that are on the course.)

C. Severe Weather

- 1. Weather forecasts and current conditions can be monitored through the [National Weather Service's Madison Weather Forecast website](#).
- 2. Before the event - If severe weather is predicted prior to the event, the EAP event representative will evaluate the conditions and determine if the event will remain scheduled. The EAP event representative or his/her designee will be identified as such Amber Wiza and will be responsible to monitor the weather conditions before and during the event.
- 3. During the event - If severe weather occurs during the event, the EAP event representative or his/her designee Amber Wiza will make notification to those attending the event that a hazardous weather condition exists and direct them to shelter.
- 4. There are very limited provisions for sheltering participants in the event of severe weather.
- 5. This event will follow the 30-30 Rule for lightning. If lightning is observed and thunder is heard within 30 seconds, the event will be delayed until 30 minutes have passed since thunder was last heard.

D. Fire

- 1. If a specific hazard has been identified as an increased risk of fire at this event, event manager will work with the Fire Department to determine how to address the hazard.
- 2. All event staff will be instructed on the safe use of Portable Fire Extinguishers.

3. If cooking is intended, you must contact the fire department and -
 - a) Must have a valid fire extinguisher, 2A10BC
 - b) Each space is allowed 1 LP tank per cooking device. All LP tanks are to be secured in an approved manner (tied, strapped, chained, etc.)
 - c) No cooking shall be allowed under a tent. Cooking shall be a minimum of 20' away from tents/canopies.
 - d) Cooking must be on a non-combustible surface (grease collection material generally required under cooking and food service areas)
4. Fire Inspectors may be required to do an inspection of your event (depends on size and nature of the event), contact the Fire Department for guidelines
5. All tents/canopies used for cooking shall have a FLAME SPREAD Certification attached to the tent.
6. Should an incident occur that requires the Fire Department, 911 will be utilized to request this resource. The caller should have the following information available to the 911 operator: nature of emergency, location, and contact person with callback number.

E. Medical Emergencies

1. As with any outdoor event, there is potential for injury to the participants. The types of injuries are various and include those that are heat related as well as traumatic injuries.
2. Event manager shall contact the Fire Department to determine if there is a need for on-site Emergency Medical Services at this event.
3. Should an incident occur that requires Emergency Medical Services to be called to this event, the caller will have the following information available to give to the 911 Center:
 - a) nature of emergency
 - b) precise location
 - c) contact person with callback number

F. Law Enforcement

1. The need for constant Law Enforcement presence at this event
 has / has not been identified. Event manager shall contact the Police Department to determine if there is a need for Law Enforcement presence at this event
2. Should an incident occur that requires Law Enforcement, to be called to this event, the caller will have the following information available to give to the 911 Center:
 - a) nature of emergency
 - b) precise location
 - c) contact person with callback number

G. Emergency Vehicle Access

1. Access for Emergency Vehicles will be maintained at all times.
2. 20' Fire Lanes are required to be kept open at events.
3. A 14' minimum height clearance requirement for anything that goes over a street or fire lane
4. Participants and spectators will be directed to park in approved areas and not to obstruct protective features, sidewalks or public thoroughways.
5. Crowd control will be managed by: Amber Wiza, course marshall volunteers.
6. Parking for vendor and staff vehicles will be: The Boneyard parking lot.
7. Parking for attendee vehicles will be: Surrounding neighborhood streets, Wal-Mart, City of Madison Fleet Service building at 4151 Nakoosa Trail, with permission (closed on Sunday) .
