Members of the Madison Food Policy Council, below are the recommendations for 2022 SEED Grants funding. Seven proposals were ultimately recommended for funding via a thorough deliberation process that included 3-member review teams to score and evaluate proposals and a group discussion on recommendation strategies. Please note that in total -- 33 applications were submitted, requesting \$267,328.80 in total funding and that the SEED Grants funding authority for 2022 is \$50,000.
