#### **WORK GROUP REPORTS**

2 56619 Community Engagement July 2019

Work Group met on June 20th and discussed partnerships and collaborations with the Center for a Livable Future (CLF) at Johns Hopkins University to inform and facilitate the

creation of a governance structure and process for the MFPC. Group discussion informed materials submitted to CLF, which include a scope of work and a letter of support from the MFPC to CLF for them to secure funding from identified sources.

Staff and work group members are waiting to hear next steps from CLF. Next regular meeting is set for August 15 because of staff travel during the week of 7/15.

Food Waste and Recovery July 2019

No report - did not meet in June

4 56621 Healthy Retail Access July 2019

Work group did not meet but HRAP Staff Team did and is still making progress on changes to the application and background letter.

5 <u>56622</u> Healthy Marketing and Procurement July 2019

Work Group met on June 19 and discussed graphics and language changes to the Healthy Vending Implementation Guide. Chair Jenn Lam is making graphics changes.

Next meeting is set for Aug. 21 because of staff travel the week of July 15.

6 <u>56623</u> Pollinator Protection July 2019

Did not meet in June. Staff is exploring linkages to Dane County groups, such as Dane County Environmental Council, in the same vein as other joint work groups like Urban Agriculture and Food Waste.

7 SEED Grants Funding July 2019

No report.

8 56625 Urban Agriculture July 2019

Work Group met last night and discussed the Dane County Strategic Planning Process, which is on-going, as well as farm leases on city land, affordable community gardens water access policy progress, and topical ideas for the August meeting.

Next meeting is scheduled for August 20.

A policy exploration for affordable water access for community gardens has begun, using the information created and compiled by the UW intern group. Staff is beginning to look at how that information can be translated into implementatble policy approaches.

Staff is still exploring how best to re-consistute this group with limited capacity/interest in filling the chair position and changes to staff roles.

- o Community meeting for interested development teams to meet with community residents on the Southside has been organized by Alder Tag Evers and South Madison Unite! For Tues 7/23 @ 530p at the Labor Temple on S Park St
  - o Final proposals are due on 8/9
- Double Dollars Core Team has been meeting and exploring the creation of a development/fundraising plan
  - o \$12,500 in funding available from a grant that WSGC received
- Reistad gave a presentation (6/22) on food systems programs and nutrition to participants in the "Cooking for the Culture" program, which is a Dane County Food Council PIE-grant funded program created by Luna's Groceries (Joe Maldonado) and Trained to Grow (Felix Giboney)
- Reistad gave a presentation (6/29) to the Uplands Watershed Group at a Small Grains Field Day at Meadowlark Farm in Ridgeway
