### GLOSSARY SEXUALITY

- <u>SOGISC</u>: Category of demographic data that includes sexual orientation, gender identity, and variations in sex characteristics
- Lesbian: A woman who is attracted to other women
- <u>Gay</u>: A man who is attracted to other men
- <u>Bisexual/Pansexual/Omnisexual/Polysexual</u>: Attraction to two or more genders
- <u>Asexual</u>: Experiencing little to no sexual attraction to other people
- <u>Aromantic</u>: Experiencing little to no romantic attraction to other people

# GENDER

- <u>Transgender person or trans person</u>: A person whose gender identity differs from the sex they were assigned at birth
- <u>Cisgender person</u>: A person whose gender identity matches the sex they were assigned at birth
- Intersex: A variety of conditions in which a person is born with a reproductive or sexual anatomy that does not fit the typical definitions of female or male.

# WHY TRACK DATA ON LGBTQ+ INDIVIDUALS?

- Advance research agendas
- Evaluate population trends
- Identify community based-needs
- Provide high-quality services
- Track and address discrimination
- Equitably distribute funding and other resources
- Shape evidence-based policy solutions to promote equity and reduce disparities faced by LGBTQ+ populations

### SURVEYING LGBTQ+ INDIVIDUALS IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS

- Collect data with specific and well-defined goals in mind
- Data should be collected, maintained, and used with strong privacy
- Entities collecting data should adopt and post clear non-discrimination and confidentiality policies
- LGBTQ+ people should be meaningfully involved in question development, testing, and evaluation

"More than 5 in 6 LGBT adults cannot be identified by existing questions in non-experimental surveys conducted by the US Census Bureau such as the ACS and the US Census" (Mahowald & Medina, 2022)



### FEDERAL DATA COLLECTION BIDEN ADMINISTRATION EXECUTIVE ORDERS

The Biden administration will be implementing the following policies that will require federal agencies to collect SOGISC data to support the LGBTQ+ community and promote equity.

- Executive Order 13988 (1/20/21)
- Executive Order 13985 (1/20/21)
- Federal Evidence Agenda on Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, and Intersex (LGBTQI+) Equity (1/24/23)

### SOGISC ITEMS FUNCTION WELL IN SURVEYS

- People generally understand questions about gender identity and sexuality and are willing to answer them
  - People with intersex traits also appear willing to answer survey questions on this topic
- Securing LGBTQ+ participants does not require an added level of effort
- Gender identity and sexuality items are answered consistently across modes (phone, paper, online surveys—self-reporting and by proxy)





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
