



Who can participate?

- Families who are expecting a new baby or have a baby under age 1.
- Families must also live in one of our service areas. (listed below).

Once in the program, families can participate until their child turns three years old.

- Allied Drive area including Rosenberry, Thurston, Crescent, Alhambra and more.
- Leopold area including Post Rd, Coho St, Leopold Rd, Greenway Cross and more.
- Southwest Madison including Wexford Ridge apartments, Russett Rd, Hammersley, Balsam, Elver Park, Schroeder, Raymond Rd and more.

What does ECI do?

Families meet weekly with a Family Support Specialist (FSS) in their home or another convenient place to focus on:


- •Finding a job or getting more education.
- Having a healthy pregnancy.
- •Learning about their child's health and development.
- •Connecting to housing, food, child care and other resources.
- •Getting along with important people in their lives.
- •Getting to know other parents with young children.

ECI offers additional services such as:

- •Benefits assistance. An *Economic Support Specialist* from the Dane County Job Center is located at each ECI site to help families with FoodShare, Child Care Assistance, BadgerCare Plus and other benefits.
