Registration in Madison – Fall 2008

- •30,000 paper registrations processed between Sept 10 and the Nov. Election
- •25,000 more registered on Election Day

20 days before the election: Peak time for the arrival of paper forms

At the same time:

- •Ballots are arriving from printer
- Testing voting machines
- •Train pollworkers, absentee ballot requests arrive in the mail, printing pollbooks, in-person-absentee voting,

Impossible to process all forms quickly

- •Poll books printed 2 wks before election
- •Then supplemental list #1,
- •Then supplemental list #2, (excel format)
- •Supplemental list #3 ??

- Started in 2002
- 2004, over 250,000 EZ Voter registrations
- 2006, over 400,000 EZ Voter registrations
- 2008, over 60 % of all AZ registrations were done online.

Arizona Single Day Statistics

October 2004 single-day: 21,400 voter registrations performed online on last day to register

October 6, 2008 single-day record:
 38,872 registrations performed online

Cost and Time to Implement

■ Start up costs about \$100,000

Implemented six months after project started

More States

- Washington started online registration in 2008
- California passed legislation in 2008
- Utah passed legislation in 2009
- Indiana both houses passed it unanimously 2009

In 2009, six more states have introduced bills: Minnesota, Michigan, New York, Colorado, Nevada, Oregon

Restrictions

- •Only open to those with a Driver's License or state ID
- •Only open until 20 days before the election

Wisconsin Stats

- •2/3 of UW-Madison freshman are Wisconsin residents (many of these will have Wis DL)
- •In 2008, 90% of those who registered in WI used DL numbers

Wisconsin online services – now in effect

Voter Public Access – look up your registration, elected officials, polling place

■ DMV – change your address online, and 6 other functions

We will continue to need

- Paper forms for some registrants
- Special Registration Deputies
- Election Day Registration
- Hard-working municipal clerks

The current methods of registration must remain in place.

Everybody Benefits

- •Those who fill out paper forms will be processed sooner, since the workload might be halved
- •Realistic goal: all forms processed by 15 days before election

As more and more people want to vote before election day

Processing registrations promptly becomes more important!!
