

'Where's Fire? Here? Well, No Need To Rush'

A lighted cigaret, which dropped into a pile of clothing, was the probable cause of the fire which badly damaged one room of the three-story Wisconsin Inn tavern and rooming house, 852 Williamson st., about 11 a. m. Wednesday, fire inspectors reported.

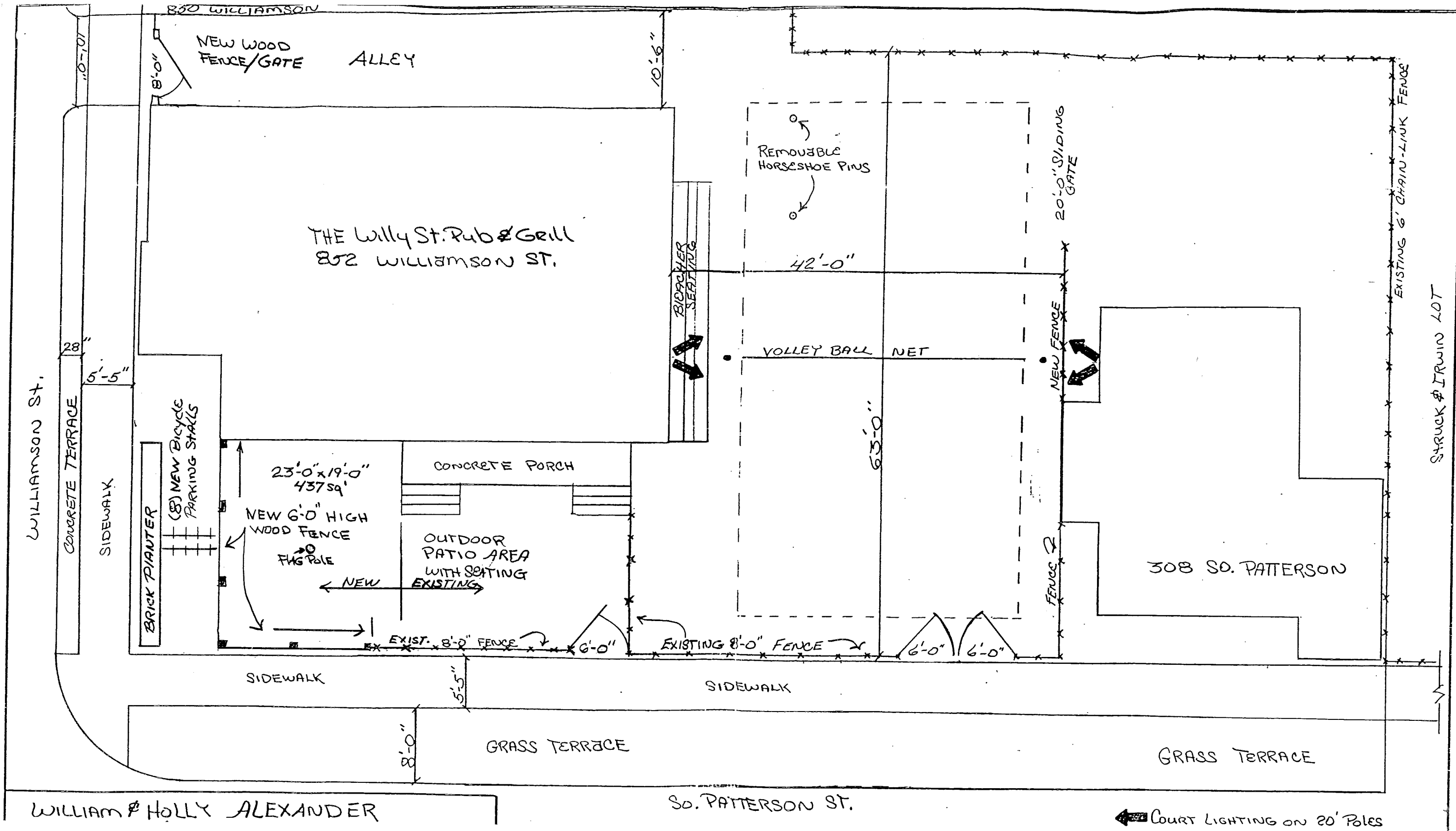
Firemen from Nos. 1 and 3 companies confined the flames

and extinguished them in the third-floor room of Leland B. White, who was not home when other roomers smelled smoke and spotted the fire.

The firefighters spent an hour ventilating smoke and mopping water from other parts of the 13-room rental quarters located on the two floors above the Wisconsin Inn tavern. None of the residents were injured. The tavern was not damaged. Mr. and Mrs. Doyne Clary own and operate the inn and tavern.
