

One camera would be placed in <u>Block DANE047</u>, approximately three feet high on a tree trunk in a woodland section of <u>Warner Park</u>, away from common foot traffic routes (e.g. paved or dirt paths) to increase likelihood of signs of wildlife. The DNR never shares the exact location of trail camera photos with the public to avoid tampering. Exact placement cannot be determined at this stage as it depends on tree density and plant height. but DNR Snapshot Wisconsin can provide the exact coordinates (latitude, longitude; photographic evidence; and physical description of placement) to the city parks board when placed. The cameras are enclosed in a locked, bear-proof box that only DNR staff and volunteers can access, and SD card files are encrypted so they can only be accessed through the DNR system.
