Board of Health for Madison and Dane County Lead Hazard Reduction

Public Health—Madison and Dane County (PHMDC) has been offered an opportunity to partner with the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (WDHS) on their Lead Hazard Reduction Grant. This grant was awarded by the US Housing and Urban Development (HUD) agency to WDHS and provides \$3 million dollars over three years to perform lead hazard reduction in Dane and Rock County homes. PHMDC will support this project by informing Dane County residents about the grant, referring families that are eligible to participate, and conduct risk assessments and clearance in some of the properties involved in the project. Families will be referred to Common Wealth Development and Project Home to apply for funds from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development to repair lead hazards. PHMDC will be reimbursed up to \$15,000 for work performed by its staff to accomplish the grant objectives.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Health for Madison and Dane County on behalf of Public Health—Madison and Dane County, authorizes the Director to sign a contract amendment with the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, for a grant of \$15,000 to be used for referral of families or property owners to the grant and risk assessment/clearance inspections performed by Department staff for the period December 15, 2009 to December 14, 2012.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the 2010 Public Health Operating Budget is amended with the following revenue and expenditures:
