Community Facilities Loan (CFL) Program

- In 2022 CDD relaunched the CFL program to support non-profit owned and managed neighborhood community facilities.
- CFL program provides low-cost financing to support shovel ready projects to acquire, expand, redevelop, improve or rehabilitate the facilities they own or lease.
 - \$1M in City GO Borrowing and \$500,000 in CDBG funds.
 - 2024 budget allocated an additional \$1M in City GO Borrowing to this program.

Neighborhood Center Operational Support

• Four neighborhood centers in a network of fifteen across the City received a total of \$366,000 in CDBG funds. These funds helped leverage \$954,385 in City levy and \$22,622 in a separate grant.

• In total **31,981 unduplicated persons** used these neighborhood center facilities in 2023.
